The Zuppigers immigrated to Canada from
Switzerland in 1986. Having run both fruit growing
and dairy operations, Joe and Margrit were looking
to try something new. In 1996 they purchased
Suncrest Vineyard with the goal of starting a land
based winery.

Manuel went back to Switzerland to train as a winemaker and returned with a keen interest to make wine in the fledgling Okanagan wine region.

Arrowleaf officially opened its doors in the spring of 2003.



Riesling 2015

Floral, apricot, pineapple and lemon aromas. On the palate it presents itself as a dry wine, with a prominent streak of fresh acidity that is the hallmark of the Riesling grape. The residual sugar is barely perceptible, yet it softens the acidity just enough to lift the fruit and let the flavours shine

On the bouquet it shows abundant black cherry, plum, coffee and clove aromas. The taste is medium bodied with rich fruit, spice and vanilla flavours lingering on the finish..

The bouquet has aromas of cherry, strawberry, violets and rose petals. The palate is light and refreshing, presenting a touch of minerality and abundant fruit flavour on the finish.
